



PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Public Administration degrees allow students to engage with communities in building their future. Specifically, we prioritize commitments to public and social issues, develop the capacity for organizations to help individuals reach their goals, and allow you to hone your own skills for leadership, management, collaboration, budgeting, and evaluation. Coursework explores the history and values of public service, while building real-world skills in areas such as managing people and resources, designing and evaluating programs, conducting human resources functions, collaborating with others and across sectors, making ethical decisions, and communicating effectively in diverse environments. The degree can be completed through a combination of online and in-person courses, or entirely online, providing students with the flexibility to schedule courses around the reality of family and work demands, while also engaging both local and fully-online students in public service opportunities in their own communities. Highly-qualified, eligible undergraduate students are provided the unique opportunity to begin working on their Master of Public Administration or Master of Public Policy degree as an undergraduate in our Pathways BA/MPA or BA/MPP program.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS & POLICIES

All CU Denver Public Administration students are required to complete the following minimum general graduation requirements:

1. Complete a minimum of 120 semester hours.
2. Achieve a minimum 2.0 CU cumulative grade point average (GPA).
3. Complete all college and major requirements.
4. Residency: Complete a minimum of 30 hours in residence at CU Denver.
5. Terminal Residency: 21 out of the last 30 hours in residence at CU Denver.

PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS & POLICIES

Students are responsible for meeting with their academic advisor in their department to confirm major requirements. This document is not an official record of degree progress. Students completing the Public Administration BA Degree are required to complete the following minimum program requirements:

1. Complete a minimum of 45 upper-division credit hours, 27 of which must be Public Administration courses offered by the School of Public Affairs.
2. Complete 15 credit hours of Public Administration electives, 9 of which may be taken from other departments with advisor approval.
3. Receive a minimum C- grade in each undergraduate course applied to satisfy major or minor degree requirements, and maintain a 2.0 GPA overall in major or minor courses.
4. Complete three courses from the Social Sciences area of the CU Denver Core Curriculum, one of which must be PUAD 1001.

Students must earn 120 credits minimum.**
