## CELEBRATE NATIONAL TRIO DAY

On February 24, 1986, a congressional resolution (H. Con. Res. 278) declared that Saturday, February 28, 1986, should be designated as "National TRIO Day" to commemorate the annual achievements of the Federal TRIO programs in communities across the country. Every year since then, our community has reserved the fourth Saturday in February as National TRIO Day — an opportunity to focus the nation's "attention on the needs of disadvantaged young people and adults aspiring to improve their lives if they are to become contributing citizens of the country, and to the talent which will be wasted if that investment is not made." For many programs, National TRIO Day has become a tradition as it allows students who benefit from the TRIO programs and to give back to their local communities through acts of service.



## RECIPE—CHOCOLATE-COVERED CHERRIES

## CHOCOLATE COVERED CHERRIES

- 2-1/2 cup of confectioners' sugar
- ✓ 1/4 cup of softened butter
- 1 tablespoon of 2% milk
- 1/2 teaspoon almond extract
- 2 jars (8oz each) of maraschino cherries with stems, well drained
- 2 cups of semisweet chocolate chips
- 2 tablespoons of shortening


#### **INSTRUCTIONS**



- 1. In a small bowl, combine confectioners' sugar, butter, milk, and extract. Knead until smooth and pliable, then shape into 1-inch balls and flatten into a 2-inch circle
- 2. Wrap 1 circle around each cherry and lightly roll in hands. Place with stem up on a waxed paper-lining baking sheet. Cover loosely and refrigerate 4 hours or overnight
- 3. In a microwave, melt chocolate and shortening; stir until smooth.
- 4. Holding on to the stems, dip the cherries into chocolate; allow excess to drip off and place on waxed paper until set.
- 5. Store in a covered container. Refrigerate 1-2 weeks before serving.

## MOVIE REVIEW—THE ACCOUNTANT



The Accountant isn't your typical action movie, and that's what makes it so intriguing. Ben Affleck steps into the role of Christian Wolff, a math genius with highfunctioning autism who lives a double life: mild-mannered accountant by day, highly skilled problem-solver for dangerous clients by night. It's a fascinating character, and Affleck nails it, blending Christian's precise, methodical nature with glimpses of vulnerability and humanity. The movie takes its time showing how Christian's unique mind works, making him not just a hero but a deeply relatable and multidimensional one.

The story picks up when Christian takes on a job auditing a robotics company's books, only to stumble into something much bigger—and deadlier—than he signed up for. From there, the film dives into a thrilling mix of action and mystery, with some killer fight scenes that are as clean and calculated as the protagonist himself. Anna Kendrick adds a nice touch of warmth as Dana, a co-worker caught in the chaos,

and J.K. Simmons brings his usual gravitas as a determined Treasury agent. While the movie has plenty of twists, some are a bit predictable, and not all the supporting characters get the development they deserve. But it's hard to complain too much when the ride is this engaging.

What really stands out about The Accountant is its heart. Sure, it's packed with action and suspense, but it's also about the struggles of someone trying to find his place in the world. Christian's backstory—especially his relationship with his father—adds an emotional layer that makes the whole thing stick with you long after the credits roll. It's not a perfect movie, but it's one that makes you think and keeps you entertained. If you're into smart action movies with a bit of soul, The Accountant is well worth your time
