



Hazard Assessments

A hazard assessment is designed to help identify potential risks in your local area and to assist in the planning for specific actions required before, during, and after each unique type of emergency. It also helps determine when an evacuation plan is required or if it is possible to shelter in place.

Individuals need to know the specific notification systems in their community for each type of hazard, the different alert and warning systems used, and methods used to get their attention (phone call, TV, radio, or door to door).
